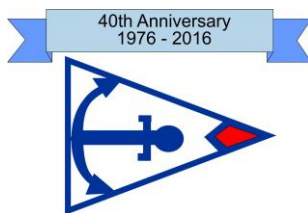

VHF/DSC Radio Course

Many boaters are under the mistaken impression that simply by purchasing a VHF radio, they have the right to use it. In Canada, we may not require the VHF Station License as they do in the USA but we are required to have a Restricted Operator's Certificate (Maritime). It is an offense subject to a \$250.00 fine when found using a VHF radio without the ROC(M).

The certificate can be earned through our VHF Radio course beginning May 17. The course runs on Tuesday evenings at Dr. Denison High School, 135 Bristol Rd, Newmarket beginning at 7:30 pm. 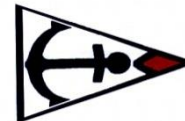

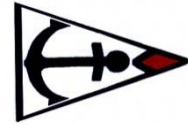
