

Ahoy fellow squadron members, it's our busiest time of year, and the last Quarterdeck that you'll have to read through a long winded blurb from me! In the next 5 weeks, we'll be doing our Easter Cruise to Bowen Island, the Annual General Meeting and Change of Watch for our new Bridge, the Commander's Ball Beach Party, the May 4th Spring Tune-Up/RVCC event, finally wrapping up with our new incoming Commander's Breakfast and Sailpast. Information is available here in the Quarterdeck so I won't waste your time reiterating, but all of these events are well worth attending. Commander's Ball Tickets can be purchased online, or by reaching out to our Socials Officer Arlene Gojevic or any of our Bridge officers can help you.

In preparation for our May 4th Spring Tune-Up, we had several volunteers, both new and existing, participate in the Transport Canada training delivered in two sessions in March. This is very good training, and our inspectors are basically prepared, but as per our standard process, new inspectors will be paired with experienced inspectors for some inspections to ensure everyone is fully prepared and ready. I am so thankful to all the volunteers who have stepped up to help! For members, or your friends with boats at Reed Point, this is a free service we provide at least once a year that can save you a minimum of \$250 in fines (we've learned of over \$2000), and even if your vessel doesn't pass the inspection, we always let you know what didn't pass and why, and offer to redo inspections when issues are remediated. We also work with local vendors and Squadron members to help as well, and often people can remediate discovered issues that same day. We are lucky enough to have member Steve Van Gaalen of Vanco Fire Protection onsite to perform free annual fire extinguisher inspections; this is a common issue we encounter during vessel inspections!

April is our peak month for membership renewals, so please consider renewing early, and consider our great new referral program that gets you a free membership if you refer two new people to the Port Moody Squadron who elect to become members. We believe people often join and stay in the Squadron because of the friendships they make and the activities they participate in, and so we are encouraging you to share our social circle with friends. Let's bring more people to the party, and perhaps to help them have fun safely on the water too!

As this is my last message as Commander, I want to take this opportunity to thank our Bridge members, whose tireless efforts help make us one of the best Squadrons in Canada, and make me proud to belong. These are people who are passionate about our members and our boating community, and it has been an honour and privilege to serve with them. This is also the




Kick off Cruise 2019! Easter Long Weekend

Boating I (PCOC)

VHF (Maritime Radio)

May 13th, 2019

Willy's Galley

The Maritime Radio course teaches emergency radio procedures and everyday operating techniques. Learn all about the uses of marine radios, choice of frequencies, operation, phonetic alphabet, procedural words and phrases, as well as Digital Selective Calling and the Global Maritime Distress and Safety System, (DSC/GMDSS). All mariners, including recreational boaters, will want to take advantage of the many features and capabilities of this innovative form "automatic" radio. Secure your lifeline. Be sure that you and your family take the Maritime Radio course. This complete package with CD, and the new Digital Selective Calling, will prepare you for the Restricted Operator Certificate (Maritime) with DSC Endorsement exam. To operate a maritime radio, you need the certificate. It's the law!



Opportunities abound for volunteers in the Port Moody Power and Sail Squadron. We serve a large number of people, and are always looking for help, and even when we have enough people, we are looking to the future and considering how to provide capabilities in the future that need training today. Here are just a few of the key roles and skills we are hoping to find among our members;

Instructors and Proctors: We have an excellent team of Instructors and Proctors, but are always looking forward to being able to increase what we can offer people from a training perspective. We're also working on a series of evening or weekend seminars open to the public. Proctoring is an excellent opportunity to get exposed to the educational arm of our Squadron, for many it is very rewarding being able to help students and in fact learn much more about the subject at hand as Proctors than they may have as students. If you'd like to help out with the training side of things, we want to speak to you!

Graphic Artist: We have a significant need for volunteers with graphic arts capabilities who can work with both raster and vector image tools. Our needs include creation and editing of graphics content for our newsletter and web presence, content employed for marketing and events, and content employed by the squadron for its business functions. Being able to work comfortably in Photoshop and Illustrator or reasonable equivalents would be desirable for this role.

Web Related: Seeking volunteers interested in helping manage our technical infrastructure, build web site functions, administer our servers and email, and help design and develop our website. We are in an interesting period of change, being driven by the CPS National changes to their systems on which much of our content resides, and anticipate either new development on that platform or moving forward with our own plans for managing web content. If you have technical skills, talk to us!

Quarterdeck: We're always looking for people to contribute articles and content that benefit Squadron members, and publish this today in both the Quarterdeck newsletter as well as our private and public Facebook presence. Shortly we expect to be expanding this to our new content management system, so that our web site also contributes to distributing this content. We're also looking for people to assist with putting together the Quarterdeck newsletter, learn the tools used to build this publication, and help us improve our newsletter moving forward.

Volunteer Officer: Just as we have a Membership Officer who focuses on recruiting new members, ensuring existing members are satisfied and their needs are being met, and being a voice for members to the Bridge, PMPSS wants to have the same focus for volunteers. This is a role aimed at members who have already served on our bridge at some point so that they have experience with how Squadron operations take place, but this is also a new role, and will develop throughout this bridge year, the most important thing you can bring to the table is your values, focus on volunteer role satisfaction, and a passion for serving our membership. You will be working closely with the Commander and Executive Officer developing this new role.

Socials Assistants: This year we are taking on more social activities, and working to include more social elements into other Squadron events like our Recreational Vehicle Courtesy Checks and our annual Shoreline Cleanup. Frankly, our Socials people are GREAT, but more hands make light work, so if you enjoy planning social activities, let us know!

RVCC Inspectors: Our 2018 Cinco de Mayo event had the largest turnout we've ever had for our Recreational Vehicle Courtesy Checks, which of course was great! What wasn't so great was that we didn't have enough qualified inspectors to meet demand, and we were not able to get to everyone who wanted an inspection. Learning to be an RVCC inspector is not difficult, is very rewarding in terms of knowing you are helping keep people safe on the water, and provides a unique learning opportunity to see other vessels and how other vessel owners are doing things and solving problems. We provide both online training and mentorship with existing Inspectors, so if you have an interest, let's discuss it further!
