It was my pleasure to be able to represent the Squadron at the 2023 Gabriola Remembrance Day ceremony and to lay our wreath along with those of other organisations on the island. The ceremony was very well attended this year.

2024 begins with some optimism as we move into planning a new round of courses, seminars and workshops. We are currently offering updated online versions of both the ROC(M) Radio Course and Boat Handling and Boat Navigation (Formerly Boating 2&3 combined) – trying to offer these courses with a local flavour. We expect to be able to continue to offer the advantages of small group support for these and other courses, such as the PCOC, the CPS-ECP online offering of which is currently under revision to allow it to be more competitive.
