His sailboat, Seaburban, has calmer and much warmer seas than in the roaring 40's not far from Antarctica, so let's wish Bert fair winds and comfortable seas the remainder of his epic journey. He left Gabriola on his solo circumnavigation via the five southern great capes at the end of October last year and hasn't touched land since. I believe he would hold the record for the longest duration in quarantine in these COVID-19 times.

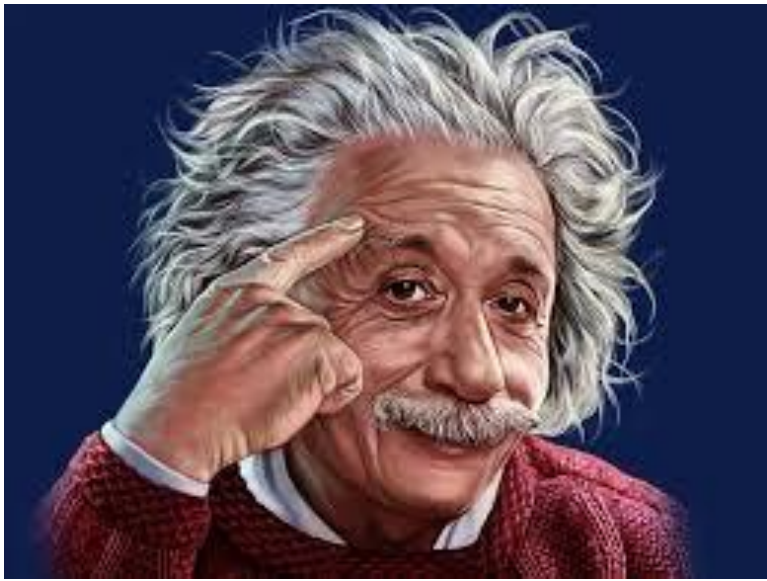
Did you really want to sail the ocean?
