### Education Officer Report – January 2023 - Gabriola Power & Sail Squadron

Since the last meeting on November 24<sup>th</sup>, 2022, I have worked at setting up the series of Wednesday evening workshops planned starting in March of 2023. The full list is available in the last edition (supplement) of Scuttlebutt. I encourage Bridge members to refer to that document to support the discussion of items on the Agenda of this January '23 meeting. Other tasks I accomplished in the past two months:

- Supervised 3 Maritime radio (Roc-M) exams (successfully passed); one from the Maritime radio study sessions held in November and two from our Self-study, online course that is now posted for registrations on the CPS-ECP website.
- Started planning the Youth Boating Camp that will be held again at the Gabriola Community Hall on South Road. This Camp will be held on May 11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup>, during two days of Professional Development for Teachers at the Gabriola Elementary School. Four volunteers have stepped up to work on the Planning committee. More are needed to work with the youth those days.
- Working with PRO Li Small to review placement of Sandwich boards on Ferry hill and in the Village. Some will need to be replaced so this is a good opportunity to change some wording on them to better inform the public about our Courses & workshops.
- I've been recruited by **National Office of CPS-ECP** to be part of the **"re-branding" project**. So far, I participated in one video-conferencing Workshop on January 23<sup>rd</sup> titled: *Landscape/Competition Audit*. Next session will be on: *Audience Definition*. Very interesting work being done by a committee of 8 persons from all regions of Canada.
- Early in the year I received an email from an Outdoor Education teacher from Global ROAMS school in Qualicum Beach enquiring about offering the Maritime Radio course to a group of 24 students. After some discussion, I accepted the offer to teach this course in two half-days in

February and administer the Exam. We will be paid \$1000 to do this. I would request some travel funds for this project.

 As a member of the Silva Bay Yacht Club Executive I have occasion to promote our Workshops and courses to that membership and I'll be working in collaboration with the Rear Commodore on Speakers for monthly "meetings" for Boaters. The plan is to open these presentations to all Gabriola Boaters.
