Minutes of the Bridge Meeting

Prior to the actual Bridge meeting, a presentation was made by Heather Earle on the Hakai project and the possible involvement of the Gabriola squadron. This was also attended by Christy Wilson who spoke to the presentation. Discussion. This terminated at 1545 with the date and time of April 7th @ 1700 suggested for training. Those interested in participating in the training session were **Ivan, Jean, Don, Nigel** and **Gary.**

The actual Bridge meeting then commenced.

Minutes of the previous meeting of February 21st, 2022: moved by Nigel, seconded by Don, that the Minutes be accepted. Approved.

The meeting agenda was approved.

Correspondence: Carole received the Nominating Committee's report.

Officers' reports submitted and to be put on the website were Financial, Communication/Privacy, Commander's, Education and Webmaster.

RVCC boat checks to be May 27, 28 & 29. **Bob** spoke on the checks and **Jean** to arrange advertising in the Sounder. **Li** has sandwich boards to advertise it as well.

Membership: Elaine complained that National were dropping off members' names including herself. **Jean** stated the need to attract new members.

Sounder: Jean met with Sarah and Derek with the proposal that the squadron submit 2 articles every month at a cost of \$100 per month. Discussion. A suggestion was made to use the Community Bulletin Board in lieu of the Sounder and it was resolved that **Li** and **Don** would use the Community Bulletin board instead of the Sounder.

Return of expired flares is confirmed for Cabela's in Nanaimo on April 30th. **Gary** mentioned that pyrotechnics are not allowed on the ferry. He has had no response from the ferry regarding hand-held emergency flares.

AGM is planned for Sunday, April 24th @ 1400 at the Community Hall upstairs. Awards were discussed and **Jean** would like suggestions for nominees.

Social: there will be a formal social following the AGM organized by **Elaine, Jude** and **Jean**. An informal social is proposed for May 28th @1600 at the food truck at Page's Inn following the boat checks.

Attracting new members: discussion on possible no fees for new members for one year.

Nominating Committee report was received by the secretary. **Ivan, Carole** and **Andy** are not standing again.

Jean would like the merit marks as soon as possible.

Bert ter Hart's next challenge is to canoe across Canada and will begin on April 1st. **Don** will write articles about it in the Sounder.
